Lindsey exemplifies the **Outstanding Athlete** through her successes at soccer and her generous commitment to the St. Anthony Girls' Soccer Team.

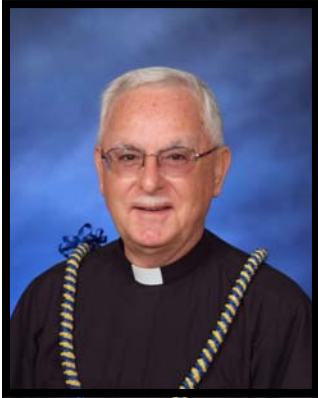

Message from the Principal...



Aloha kakou !

In just a few more months we will be sending out another class of graduates from St. Anthony. This Class of 2010 will join the thousands of you who already hold that same honor and distinction. It's no secret that the number of graduates is decreasing. The economic downturn has impacted our Maui families and many are unable to enroll their children because of the loss of jobs, closure of businesses, decline in tourism and rising living expenses.

While we may be lacking in quantity, we are certainly not lacking in quality. Our graduates continue to receive both acceptance letters and scholarships from top-level colleges and universities. Our academic track record may be Maui's best kept secret because we don't spend as much money advertising as we should. Student performance in both academic and extra-curricular activities is building steadily, and we were commended by the Accreditation Committee for having such a wide variety of courses and extra-curricular opportunities available for our young men and women. We were also commended for the Catholic/Christian spirit that is being taught by our faculty and lived out by our students. We received other commendations, but those were the best of all because it means that we are succeeding in fulfilling our mission as a top-quality college preparatory Catholic school.

We want to enable more students to enroll at St. Anthony and so we have been working on a special Capital Campaign that will create a \$5 million endowment fund to provide additional financial assistance to those who need it. 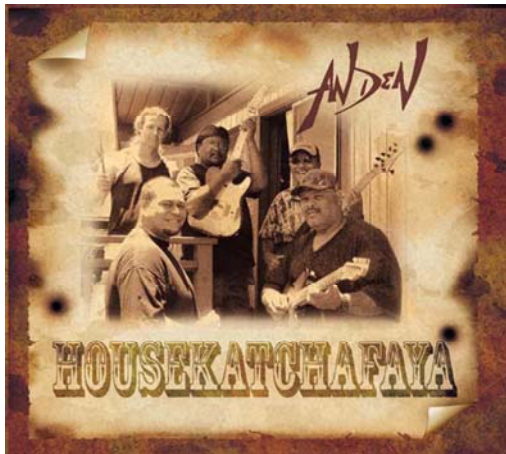

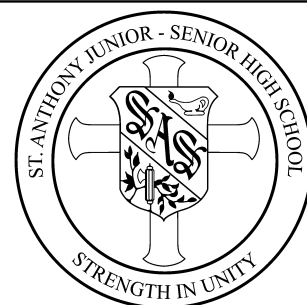
